(C) I was contacted by Kirk Hempel of V.A.F.B. - O.S.I. RE: information he had received about possible 288 activity between a Terence Stevens and a 14 year old boy who is a friend of his. Hempel related that he had contacted a John Smith who is a current and past co-worker of Terence Stevens at Cal State Security on V.A.F.B. According to Smith, he felt there was an out of the ordinary relationship between Terence Stevens and a 14 year old boy by the name of [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] is the son of a [REDACTED] on base. [REDACTED] lives in Vandenberg Village, while Stevens lives in the city of Lompoc. It is believed that some of the contact occurred on base, while other occurred at the residence of Stevens. It was unknown at that time if any contact had occurred in the Vandenberg Village area. According to Smith, Stevens and [REDACTED] had known each other for about 3 years and had developed an extremely close relationship. This relationship stemmed from Stevens coaching youth soccer along with [REDACTED] and Stevens joint involvement in refereeing soccer games.

CONFIDENTIAL

According to Smith, about two years prior when both Smith and Stevens were guards at building 7000 on V.A.F.B., Stevens had brought [REDACTED] to the building to show him around. They left and about 4 hours later Stevens and [REDACTED] returned. Smith asked where they had been. Stevens said that they had gone to the womens lounge 3 floors up and [REDACTED] had fallen asleep on the couch. Stevens sat down and waited for [REDACTED] to awaken, and then fell asleep himself.

Smith had also heard from a Mark Frasier that about one and a half months ago there had been a slumber party at the residence of Stevens in the city of Lompoc. Several boys who had attended the slumber party slept on the floor in the living room.

party involved All-Stars or past team mates involved in youth soccer.

Stevens and [redacted] had also apparently gone on camping trips together, and had stayed overnight together on several occasions.

The room mates of Stevens were identified as [redacted] and [redacted].

Supposedly [redacted] and Terence Stevens were very good friends several years ago, but have since not been such good friends. [redacted] and [redacted] father was [redacted], who is the operations officer for Cal State Security on V.A.F.B.

Smith had gone to high school with Stevens. Smith said that Stevens never had any girlfriends, and never seemed to be interested in girls. He spent most of his time with the young boys of his soccer teams, and tending to their needs. He would play games on the weekends with them, and apparently the parents had become concerned about the relationship as they had somewhat restricted [redacted]'s involvement with Stevens.

CONFIDENTIAL

Another Cal State Employee had supposedly mentioned that they had heard Stevens and [redacted] talk on the phone in which they would talk in whispers so that no one else around could hear what they were saying. He thought this was similar to what a boyfriend/girlfriend relationship would consist of.

The father of [redacted], [redacted], was called in to the OSI office and interviewed. He was interviewed by Det. Bailey, Agent Hempel and myself. He stated that at one time he had been concerned about the relationship between Stevens and his son, and asked about any unseemingly activity. [redacted] denied any of this. He put restrictions on [redacted] simply to encourage him to become friends with people his own age.

Mr [redacted] was unaware of the tour of building 7000, and had not heard anything about it. [redacted] said that his son refereed with Stevens and had been trained by Stevens. Stevens had been a family friend for three years, and gets along with [redacted] real well. He would say that they were both very good friends. He had allowed his son to spend the night with Stevens up until a year ago, and then thought he was too old to do so. The last two weekends that they were together, they went to tournaments in Los Osos and Arroyo Grande with a kid named [redacted]. His understanding was that there was just enough time to respond to these tournaments, and return home. They would referee these tournaments. He did not allow his son to see Stevens during the week. He knew nothing about a slumber party in the past couple of months. Also present were [redacted] and [redacted]. Both are the same age as [redacted]. [redacted] now resides in the Bakersfield area. The slumber party was a couple of years ago. During the times that they would be together, they would do things like "depantsing" each other, tickle each other, and do otherwise juvenile activities. He said that there was no sexual nature to this contact at all, but that they would tickle each other alot.

[redacted] was later interviewed at the Sheriff's Station by Det. Bailey, Hempel and I. According to [redacted], there was one incident where there was skin to skin contact at his genitals. This occurred one time when he was at a slumber party at Stevens house in the Village. He was the only one there besides Stevens. They were goofing around and Stevens depantsed [redacted] and grabbed him in the crotch with his hand. [redacted] then returned the gesture. He then pulled his pants up. According to [redacted] there was no sexual nature to this contact. This had happened about two years ago, but he could not recall specifically when. There had been other times where there was grabbing of the crotch outside the

2. had previously lived at 206 N 'R' St.

4. According to [REDACTED], he was not offended by this contact, and did not consider it
5. unseemly.

6.
7. According to [REDACTED], there had never been sexual contact between himself and Stevens.
8. He described Stevens as a heterosexual, and described himself as that also.

9. According to [REDACTED], Stevens had girlfriends, but he knew nothing about the
10. relationship between Stevens and his girlfriend.

11.
12. According to [REDACTED], on only one occasion has Stevens shown films of a sexual
13. nature. He said it was a heterosexual type film, and he did not like it himself.
14. [REDACTED] chose not to watch much of it.

15.
16. Following the interview, Mr and Mrs [REDACTED] were briefed as to the facts of the
17. interview with their son. They seemed relatively unconcerned with the facts
18. that were revealed, agreeing that it appeared to be a juvenile conduct.

19. They thought of Stevens as a good family friend, and felt that he really liked
20. the kids so that there was little to be concerned with.

3. (C) At 1450 hours on 1-20-89, Det Joe Bailey of the LOPD and myself responded to
4. the OSI office on VAFB where a previously scheduled meeting with Terence Stevens
5. was to take place.

7. Prior to the interview of Stevens, he was advised of his rights per Miranda off of
8. an SH-376 card. He stated he understood his rights by saying "Yeah". He was
9. advised briefly of why we were interviewing him, mentioning to him the inuendos
10. and allegations that had been made without mentioning the individuals who had
11. made them. Stevens then stated that the entire incident stemmed from a situation
12. about a month ago at work. He said that during a day off co-workers Al Lindsey
13. and John Smith decided to change the seating in the office that was shared by the
14. three of them. This was done without Stevens knowledge or consent, and when he
15. returned he became annoyed at the way it was changed. The three of them started
16. to discuss this, and the discussion turned to shouting and tempers flared. Since
17. that time they have not gotten along at all. While the argument was going on,
18. John Smith called Stevens lazy and accused him of not making the rounds that he
19. was paid to make in previous work assignments, namely acting as a guard in building
20. 7000 at VAFB. He also mentioned something about "bringing little boys into the
21. building". He made allusions that he was going to get Terence Stevens in trouble,
22. but did not specifically say that. At one time he also made the statement that
23. there would be plenty of room in the office when he got done.

24.
25. When asked what John Smith could have been referring to when he made these allegations
26. about little boys, Terence Stevens stated that on two possibly three occasions
27. he had brought kids to the work site with him. This happened during the midnight
28. shift when the kids were supposed to be staying the night at the site.

1. and he would bring them to work to spend the night while he did his rounds. He
 2. believes that this would have been [redacted] on one occasion, and was not certain
 3. as to who the other individual could have been but thought possibly [redacted].
 4. Stevens stated that he was unsure of whether or not these children were allowed
 5. at the work site, but mentioned that Lt George McPherson who was his supervisor
 6. would have probably seen them during his rounds of the evening and he would have
 7. thought made some sort of comment if they were not allowed to be present.

8.
 9. These visits were on the weekends as far as he can tell, and there would have been
 10. 10 to 15 FEC employees there he believes. He also believes there would have
 11. been two other employees with him at any time, but could not be certain as to
 12. who those would have been. He believes John Smith would have been one, David
 13. Rose could have been another, and Gordon Woodberry is a possible third.

 15. According to Terence, Smith and he have never really gotten along due to John Smith's
 16. cockyness. They don't really care for each other though it's really never interfered
 17. with their work relationship, it is just a known fact between the two of them that
 18. they just don't like each other. Since the arguement about a month ago, they have
 19. not spoken to each other at all. Lindsey and himself work in the same car, and they
 20. don't even talk while driving from place to place.

21.
 22. At this time Stevens was questioned further about visits by children to his house.
 23. He said that over night visits were not frequent, and that [redacted]'s visits were kept
 24. to a minimum by his parents. He believes that [redacted] slept over less than 10 times
 25. in total. [redacted]'s parents have also eliminated phone calls between the two of them.
 26. According to Terence, the [redacted] family is a touchy feely very nice and open
 27. family. He himself does not come from such a background. He says that [redacted]

1. and tickling him and wrestling. This was contact which was enjoyed mutually by
2. both, as it was apparently normal behavior for the [REDACTED] family according to Terence.

3.
4. When we told him that [REDACTED] had said the the situation was the opposite that his
5. family was not very contact oriented and that Stevens was, Stevens found that odd.
6. He says that the family is fairly contact oriented.

7.
8. Stevens says that the tickling and wrestling would only happen in the evening hours
9. when it was time for him to go to bed, and which is kind of fun and games for both
10. of them. He admitted that he probably did grab the crotch of [REDACTED] on probably
11. two occasions. He did not believe that he was naked or it was repeated contact
12. other than just a one time thing. He believes it happened two years ago, and both
13. occurrences were fairly close to each other. He described the physical contact
14. as a hit or slap in order to get [REDACTED] off of him during a tickling time, or to get
15. his attention. He says it only heppened when the two of them were together, and
16. not between any others. He said that he did not think that [REDACTED] would construe
17. this as sexual contact at all. When he was asked if it could have possibly happen
18. during one of the pantsing incidents when his clothes were off he said it was
19. entirely possible but he had no specific recollection of that.

21. Stevens said that he enjoyed the interaction between himself and [REDACTED], and considers
22. himself and [REDACTED] good friends. He says that [REDACTED] is not the kind of child that
23. would allow him to take liberties with him, and that [REDACTED]'s parents are the ones
24. that would not put up with any kind of unseemingly conduct between the two of them.

25.
26. Stevens was convinced that the entire allegations stemmed from a vendetta by Smith
27. due to this fight at work.

1. Stevens was admonished that the contact between the two of them was probably
 2. inappropriate though not specifically illegal at this time. He seemed to understand
 3. that advisement.

4.
 5. For the lack of any specific evidence of a criminal act, it appears that this is
 6. simply a juvenile act by an adult. If any illegal activity would have occurred,
 7. it would have to come from statements by [REDACTED] which have not been made.

8. It appears that it is entirely possible that these allegations though are somewhat
 9. founded and they are major as far as what has happened are not found founded as
 10. far as what criminal things are construed by the allegations. This being the case
 11. the investigation is cleared and closed on its merits which are little.
